REGISTRATION – OTHER VOLUNTEERS

REGISTRATION – REGULAR CONTACT

USA Hockey considers all of the following persons to have "regular contact" – those that have frequent or routine contact – with minor participants

- Members of the Affiliate Board of Directors,
- Member Program administrators, including board members, hockey directors and other program staff who have regular contact with or authority over minor Participants
- Coaches
- Team managers
- Referees

- Locker room monitors
- Travel chaperones
- Team drivers (unless professional transportation companies are used)
- Other persons whose position allows them to have frequent or routine contact with minor Participants

USA Hockey **DOES NOT** consider persons serving solely in the following roles to have "regular contact" with minor Participants:

Scorekeepers

Penalty box operators

Concession stand workers

Arena entry/ticket takers



REGISTRATION - CREDENTIALS

All coaches, managers and other volunteers with "Regular Contact" with minor Participants must have up to date certifications/registrations. Incomplete or lapsed credentials will prohibit rostering.

USA Hockey has **ZERO TOLERANCE** for abuse and misconduct.

- The SafeSport Handbook includes the various Policies that apply to all USA Hockey Member Programs. Those Policies address:
- Sexual Abuse
- Physical Abuse
- Emotional Abuse
- Bullying, Threats and Harassment
- Hazing

The Policies also address areas where misconduct can occur and are intended to reduce the risk of potential abuse, including:

- Locker Room Policy
- Electronic Communications Policy
- Travel Policy
- Billeting Policy



SAFESPORT KEY POINTS

- LOCKER ROOMS need at least one responsible screened and trained adult present at all times and monitoring the locker room during all team events to assure that only Participants (coaches and players), approved team personnel and family members are permitted in the locker room and to supervise the conduct in the locker room. While it is not always possible, two locker room monitors are preferable. Enforce a zero-tolerance policy regarding inappropriate behavior in the locker room.
- COMMUNICATIONS with minor participants via email or text must include a parent/guardian and should be non-personal in nature. If a coach or manager utilizes social media pages as a team communication tool, it must be accessible to all participants, parents and guardians.
- **ELECTRONIC DEVICES** are not to be used to record sound, images or video in the locker room. Showing videos or images in the locker room should be limited to a coach using it for play review, etc. Best practice no phones in the locker room.
- TRAVEL POLICY Your Association is required to have one. It can be more stringent, but not less stringent, than the USA Hockey travel policy. You can also develop a team policy (same conditions apply).



COACHING EDUCATION PROGRAM (CEP)

Required Coaching Education Program Levels for Ice Hockey

- All coaches must enter USA Hockey's Coaching Education Program at Level 1 and must continue their education with a coaching clinic each year until, at a minimum, they achieve Level 4. Coaches have the option of completing Level 5.
- Coaches of only 8U players may remain at Level 1 until such time as they are coaching any older age level of play.
- All coaches must have the required certification level by January 1 of the current season. All coaches must complete the online
 age-specific modules PRIOR to participating with their team. A coach may attend only one (1) clinic per year, but can complete
 more than one age-specific module in any given season.
- Level 4 is valid for three (3) seasons. Before the expiration of Level 4, coaches must complete 5 credit hours of continuing education within each subsequent three-year period by either taking Level 5, or by attending other USA Hockey continuing education clinics.
- For those coaches who received Level 4 or Level 5 PRIOR TO January 1, 2021, and are rostered on a Tier I or Tier II team, are required to complete the five (5) credit hours of continuing education within a three-year period to remain current.
- Coaches with any expired certification will retain their previous certification level provided the certification can be verified. Coaches may re-enter the certification system at that previous level and be subject to the certification guidelines.



COACHING EDUCATION PROGRAM (CEP)

Continuing Education Credits

 USA Hockey is in the process of producing Continuing Education curriculum. The virtual clinics and modules will be released in September on the USA Hockey website.

CEP Card Number

 Prior to the start of games throughout the season, all coaches are required to indicate their current CEP status on the scoresheet, including their (CEP) card number, level, agespecific module and the year their CEP level expires.


TEAM REGISTRATION AND ROSTERING


- USA Hockey Rosters must be submitted to NJYHL Registrar before the first NJYHL game is played.
 This URL must also be uploaded into ScorekeeperWEB by Organizational Manager.
- 20 players maximum; 10 players minimum (6U/8U excluded).
- Rule 25 player movements between teams through 12/31 is permitted approvals are required
- A player cannot be rostered on more than one NJYHL team.
- A player cannot compete in the NJYHL if he/she is also rostered on a Tier I youth team.
- 16U/18U players may roster with a Tier I or Junior team at the conclusion of the NJYHL team's season but will be ineligible for post-season participation with their NJYHL team once released.
- 2011 players can <u>NOT</u> play up
- Players must be rostered to participate.
- Coaches and managers <u>MUST</u> be rostered to participate.



REQUIRED FORMS

On the NJYHL website, under FORMS, you will find the following REQUIRED forms which must be submitted with 24 hours prior notice.





INJURIES AND INSURANCE

- All penalty boxes need adult supervision if the player cannot enter or exit the penalty box safely on his own. If the penalty box is immediately adjacent to the player bench, it must be supervised by a credentialed coach.
- If a major injury occurs, please notify the NJYHL Registrar and Risk Manager.

USA HOCKEY CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT RETURN TO PLAY FORM

The USA Hockey Concussion Management Protocol and most state statutes require that an athlete be removed from any training, practice or game if they exhibit any signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion or are suspected of sustaining a concussion. The player should not return to physical activity until he or she has been evaluated by a qualified medical provider who has provided written clearance to return to sports.

This form is to be used after an athlete has been removed from athletic activity due to a suspected concussion and must be signed by their medical provider in order to return without restriction to training, practice or competition.

RULES, REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES

USA Hockey and New Jersey Youth Hockey League

USA Hockey rules govern except as modified in the NJYHL Guidebook



NJYHL RULES AND REGULATIONS 2023-2024 SEASON

- We recommend you read the entire <u>NJYHL Guidebook</u> to familiarize yourself with the rules and regulations.
- All ice hockey coaches and instructors of registered USA Hockey Youth 18 & Under and below, high school, girls'/women's 19 & under and below, and disabled programs must properly wear an approved ice hockey helmet during all on-ice sessions, including practices, controlled scrimmages and all Coaching Education Program clinics and/or workshops. Penalty for not wearing a helmet is a minimum thirty (30) day suspension.



IMPROPER CONDUCT

- All individuals associated with the NJYHL or one of its member Associations (coaches, players, volunteers, Association leadership and spectators) are expected to conduct themselves in a proper manner at all times.
- Improper conduct is defined as behavior deemed detrimental to the philosophy and objectives of the league, as well as any action which produces results detrimental to any team or individual players in the League.
- Repeated instances of improper conduct shall be dealt with by the Executive Board, which may include suspension of the player from the next game as a result of parental behavior.



ZERO TOLERANCE OFFICIATING ABUSE POLICY

- The Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association (AAHA) published a revised zero-tolerance policy that aims to eliminate abusive behavior by spectators at games directed at game officials and other participants.
- Any spectator who is removed from a game for abusive, profane, or other unacceptable conduct directed at any game official or other participant shall be subject to discipline, whether the removal from the game is by a game official or arena personnel, or if the alleged Abusive Conduct is investigated after the fact by the proper Disciplinary Authority (i.e. Association, League, or Affiliate) and found to be have occurred by a preponderance of proof.
- "Abusive Conduct" may include any loud, obscene, or otherwise offensive language or gesture.



ZERO TOLERANCE OFFICIATING ABUSE POLICY

- First Offense: Suspension from all activities involving the team for a minimum of thirty (30) days, a maximum of ninety (90) days;
- Second Offense: Suspension from all activities involving the team for a minimum of sixty (60) days, a maximum of one hundred twenty (120) days;
- Third Offense: Suspension from all USA Hockey activities for a period of one (1) Year from the date of the incident or from the date of the findings of an investigation of the Abusive Conduct. The individual will be required to complete a certified anger management class and provide the AAHA with a certificate of completion to be eligible to be a spectator at USA Hockey games and practices within the AAHA.
- Abusive Conduct in games involving minor-age officials: Should the Abusive Conduct occur in a game where any of the assigned game officials are 18 or younger, the stated penalties shall double, regardless of whether the abusive conduct is directed at the minor-age official.

Suspensions include all activities, including practices (on-ice, dry land, and meetings), tournaments and all games (District or Non-District).

ARENA ENTRY EXCEPTION: A suspended parent/guardian shall be permitted to enter the rink if their child has been injured and needs the parent/guardian's assistance to assess their child's well-being and ability to return to play or assist the child in undressing to leave the arena for medical evaluation. Should the player return to the ice or player's bench, the suspended parent/guardian must exit the building immediately.

ZERO TOLERANCE OFFICIATING ABUSE POLICY

- To report allegations of Abusive Conduct directed at on-ice and/or off-ice officials, please use the above link. This link is also on the NJYHL website.
- The identity of reporters will be kept confidential however reporters must provide their name and valid contact information.
- Anonymous reports, especially those presented without corroborating evidence such as video, are not likely to be acted upon.
- Allegations of verbal abuse by game officials shall be reported to the team's Club President, who will submit the report to the AAHA President and Referee-in-Chief.



GAME LENGTH

The home team is responsible for providing sufficient ice time and the necessary facilities for playing the game. Ice time shall be assigned as follows per division (each must include a 5-minute warm-up and 1 minute of rest between periods):

10U	15 MINUTES	N/A	1 HOUR 15 MINUTES
12U	15 MINUTES	3 MINUTES	1 HOUR 15 MINUTES
14U	16 MINUTES	3 MINUTES	1 HOUR 30 MINUTES
16U/18U	17 MINUTES	3 MINUTES	1 HOUR 30 MINUTES

**At the 12U level and older, if an NJYHL game is tied at the end of regulation, the teams will play one 3-minute 3v3 sudden death overtime. Teams take a one-minute rest after the end of regulation play and do not switch ends.

MINIMUM NUMBER OF PLAYERS

A team must start a game with a minimum of six (6) players. Any time that a team has been reduced to less than four (4) players, the game shall be declared a forfeit. The forfeit may be appealed to the Commissioner in the event of extraordinary circumstances.



GAME LENGTH

- if <u>AFTER</u> two periods one team takes a 8 goal lead the game will use a running clock
- If the losing team scores to pull within 7 goals stop time will resume
- If the winning team regains an 8 goal lead the game will return to a running clock
- if <u>AFTER</u> two periods one team has a 10 goal lead the game will end

Any head coach whose team incurs 12 penalties is suspended from the next scheduled game. The head coach does not leave the bench.

A player who receives 4 penalties in any game will result in the player being suspended from the next scheduled game. A player who receives 4 penalties receives a Game Misconduct penalty and must leave the bench.

If the next scheduled game is not an NJYHL game, the coach/player will be required to sit for two games. The first non-league game played serves as the obligation to the NJYHL.

Any coach or player who is assessed a game misconduct penalty may not remain near the bench of their team, nor in any way attempt to direct the play of their team, for the balance of the game in which the game misconduct penalty has been issued.

^{*} For any major penalty, a game misconduct penalty assessed shall cause the player to be suspended for their team's next game. This one-game suspension is in addition to any other required suspensions incurred during the same incident. Fighting penalties receive additional discipline per NJYHL Guidebook.

^{**}Players/coaches receiving a Match Penalty are suspended from all USA Hockey activities for 30 days or until the appropriate authority has made a ruling.


GAME ACCESS DURING SUSPENSION


- For any Team Official or Player serving a suspension for a prior game misconduct violation or disciplinary suspension, the suspension will <u>commence 45 minutes prior to the start of each game and conclude 30 minutes following the conclusion of each game</u>.
- The Team Official or Player serving the suspension shall be prohibited from:
 - Having any interaction, involvement or communication "in person," electronically or otherwise with the team
 - Being present in the locker room
 - Being on or near the bench of their team
- Any violation of this Rule may result in supplementary discipline and may subject such Team Official or Player to further disciplinary proceedings.
- Game Misconducts assessed in non-league games must also be submitted to the NJYHL via website form.

EXPECTATIONS

- NJYHL games take precedence over all other commitments (other leagues, tournaments, etc.).
- NJYHL GAMES CANNOT BE UTILIZED FOR NON-NJYHL COMMITMENTS NO DOUBLE-DIPPING PLEASE.
- Leave room in your team schedules to enable rescheduling of potentially postponed games.
- All games are scheduled (or rescheduled) by the Master Scheduler and must be entered into Scorekeeper before the start of the season (rosters too).
- Approval is required for any game changes once the schedules are final.
- All games <u>MUST</u> be played no FORFEITS there are fines.
- A suspended game will resume where the game was stopped. Any ineligible player in the initial game cannot participate when game is resumed.
- Two full periods must be played for game to be official must be stop time no running clock 10 goal mercy rule.
- It is recommended non-league games follow the same rules as NJYHL games
- DON'T FORGET TO CONFIRM ALL GAMES LAST MINUTE CHANGES CAN HAPPEN!
- ADD YOUR INFORMATION TO THE HEAD COACH AND MANAGER CONTACT LIST SEE THE NJYHL WEBSITE FOR DETAILS

INCLEMENT WEATHER

- The Commissioner will determine if weather cancellations are appropriate.
- All weather cancellations must be rescheduled within seven calendar days by the Master Scheduler must be notified of the change.





GAME RESPONSIBILITIES – OFF ICE OFFICIALS

- The scorekeeper and timekeeper are considered off ice officials.
- They should know the rules of the game and also know how to operate the clock.
- They should NOT be coaching from the scorekeeper's box.
- They should NOT be cheerleading from the scorekeeper's box.
- If the scorekeeper or timekeeper are not sure of the direction received from the official, they should ask for clarification immediately.






GAME RESPONSIBILITIES – OFF ICE OFFICIALS

- Prior to the start of the game, the Official Scorer shall obtain on the scoresheet the signatures of all coaches of each team, one of whom shall be designated as Head Coach, along with the CEP card number, CEP level and the year the CEP level was attained for each coach.
- The Official Scorer shall keep a record of each goal scored by indicating those player(s) who are credited with scoring the goal and any assists. No request for changes to the officials scoring shall be considered unless they are made at or before the conclusion of the game.
- Confirm player/coach roster reflects bench attendance note starting goalie name and number.
- The coach is responsible for reviewing the score sheet at the end of the game before it is signed and initialed. Once it is signed and initialed, changes cannot be made.
- Remind team families that website statistics will not be corrected unless it impacts the outcome of the game.
- Remind team families that all contact with the NJYHL must come through your Association's NJYHL Delegate.

FULL ICE GAMES

• The Atlantic Amateur Hockey Association does not permit the playing of full ice games at the 6U or 8U levels at any time.

BIRTH YEARS

- 8U 2015-2017 6U 2017 and younger*
- 2015 and 2016 birth year players ARE NOT permitted to play at the 10U level. NO WAIVER REQUESTS
 ACCEPTED.
- 2014 birth year players ARE NOT permitted to play at the 8U level. They must play at 10U level.
- Rosters listing birth year players that are outside of the required age bracket will not be processed in accordance with the AAHA rules.
- *2017 birth year (6U) players CAN play on 8U teams, but cannot move to the 10U level until age appropriate.

PLAY-IN GAMES ADVANCEMENT TO NJYHL PLAYOFFS

At the 12U-18U levels, a single elimination game is played to determine advancement to NJYHL playoffs.

Detailed information is on the NJYHL website - "Important Notices and Presentations."

Example:

 2nd and 3rd place in points/win pct. in each division plays a single game hosted by higher seed. Winner advances to NJYHL playoffs.



ADVANCEMENT TO AAHA AFFILIATE TOURNAMENT

At the 12U-18U levels, the NJYHL advances teams to either the AAHA National-Bound Championships or the AAHA Affiliate Championships.

At the National-Bound Levels (18AA, 16AA, 14AA)

- NJYHL Playoff Champion advances as the 1st Seed to the AAHA Championship.

 NJYHL 2nd, 3rd place in Playoffs advances to Qualifier round vs 1st and 2nd place independent teams. Format is a 4 team round robin for points. Team earning highest points in Qualifier round advances as 2nd seed at the AAHA Championship.

At the Affiliate Championship Levels (18A, 16A-National, 14A-National, 12AA, 12A-National)

NJYHL Playoff 1st, 2nd and 3rd place advance to Affiliate Championship vs 1st place NJ independent team, 1st and 2nd place DVHL teams and 1st and 2nd place PA/DE independent teams. Format is an 8 team/2 pool round robin with championship game.

At the Affiliate Championship Levels (14B, 12B-National)

- NJYHL Playoff Champion advances as the 1st Seed to the AAHA Affiliate Championship.

 NJYHL 2nd place in Playoffs advances to single elimination game vs 1st place NJ independent team. Winner advances as 2nd seed at the AAHA Affiliate Championship.




14U, 16U, 18U PLAYER PLAYOFF ELIGIBILITY

- To be eligible to participate in NJYHL Playoffs at the 14U, 16U and 18U levels, each player must participate in a minimum of 50% of the League games scheduled for the team.
- Any player rostered after the end of League play is ineligible for post-season play. In the event of an injury
 or other extraordinary circumstances, the Executive Board reserves the right to waive this rule.
- It is the responsibility of the individual teams to ensure that all their players are eligible.
- If a team uses an ineligible player in a playoff game, that game will be declared a forfeit and a fine of \$1,000 will be assessed.
- Once AAHA Tournament advancing teams are set, any player that leaves an advancing team to join a Tier
 I or Junior level team must be removed from the NJYHL roster and will be ineligible to participate in the
 AAHA tournament.



TOURNAMENTS

- Any tournament that your teams participate in should be a USA Hockey sanctioned tournament.
- Sanctioned tournaments provide consistent rules, penalty assessments, age categories, and insurance coverage.

SCORE KEEPER WEB SYSTEM - COMMUNICATION

 Each organization has a point person for questions/issues. It is their:

Master Scheduler

 All questions should be directed to the NJYHL through their Master Scheduler.



PAPER SCORE SHEETS

- The home team is responsible for providing and completing the paper score sheet.
- It is the home team scorekeeper's responsibility to accurately record penalties as called by the officials.
- The scorekeeper must know how to record penalties on a score sheet to accurately reflect the number of penalties assessed (i.e. a double minor is listed as 2 separate minor penalties, one per line).
- The score sheet is a one page form. The visiting team must take a photo or ask for a copy to be made at the rink if they wish to have a hard copy.
- THE HOME TEAM IS RESPONSIBLE FOR RETAINING THE SCORE SHEET. IN THE EVENT A SCORE SHEET NEEDS TO BE REVIEWED BY THE NJYHL, IT WILL BE REQUESTED FROM THE HOME TEAM ELECTRONICALLY WHO MUST PRODUCE IT WITHIN 24 HOURS OF REQUEST.
- PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THE FULL SEASON OF SCORE SHEETS MAY NEED TO BE PRESENTED AT THE END OF THE SEASON TO CONFIRM PLAYOFF ELIGIBILITY. KEEP THEM IN ORDER AND IN A SAFE PLACE.
- Please print legibly so the information on the score sheet can be read.
- NJYHL has developed Tips and Tricks for Scorekeeping/Penalty recording. See the NJYHL website for details.

SCOREKEEPER SYSTEM – DATA ENTERED

- The information entered into the ScoreKeeperWEB system should exactly match the paper score sheet.
- The scorekeeper MUST know the difference between a MISCONDUCT and a GAME MISCONDUCT.
 - A GAME MISCONDUCT will result in a suspension for the player or coach.
 - A second misconduct in a game is an automatic GAME MISCONDUCT and should be input as such.
- It is the responsibility of the home team to maintain an official record of each game. Teams should use the score sheet provided by the League at the beginning of the season. The score sheet will be the official record and must be signed by the referees. The game details must be uploaded to ScorekeeperWEB within 24 hours of the game or before the next League game for the teams on the scoresheet, whichever is sooner.
- A player that is serving a suspension will be red-lined in the system for the next game.
- Any game not uploaded within 24 hours will be subject to a \$100 fine. Any team consistently delinquent in sending in a game score sheet may receive an additional penalty at the discretion of the Commissioner.
- Only the NJYHL can rule a game as a forfeit. It cannot be done by any coach, manager or official.

The NJYHL will not revise any game statistic entered unless it has an impact on the outcome of the game (final score or player/coach suspension).



SCOREKEEPER WEB SYSTEM - ROSTERS

- All roster changes need to be made <u>PRIOR</u> to a game being played. All information is date and time stamped electronically. If a roster change is made after a game has been played, the player will not be listed on the roster for that game.
- Should a roster change happen after a game is played, your Master Scheduler must e-mail statistician@njyhl.org asking to backdate the roster so that the game can be correctly scored. There is a fine for making this correction.
- All roster changes also have to be sent not less than 24 hours in advance of the game via forms on the NJYHL website (Player Substitution form or Goaltending Coverage form).





SCOREKEEPER WEB SYSTEM - HELP

- The ScoreKeeperWEB system has a HELP tab. It contains a .pdf file with easy-to-follow screenshots describing how to enter game data into the system.
- This is accessible once logged in with the User Name and Password provided by the NJYHL.
 If you have not yet received your login credentials, please check with your Master Scheduler.
- Please also refer to the penalty entry samples on the NJYHL website under SCHEDULES AND STANDINGS/Scoring Quick Reference/Penalty Entry Examples.
